

HISTORY OF THE WORLD CUP COMPETITION

More than a hundred years of competitive footballing activity lie behind the staging of the first-ever World Cup competition in England, ancestral home of the most universal of all games. With its Centenary already happily celebrated, it was appropriate that the Football Association should have been accorded the privilege of staging the Final Series of the eighth tournament for the prized Jules Rimet Cup.

While the competition itself is comparatively youthful against the complete background of football history, it has gone from strength to strength in the four decades since the first World Cup Competition was staged in South America.

It is 62 years since the Federation Internationale de Football Association was formed, at a meeting attended by representatives of Belgium, Denmark, France, the Netherlands, Spain and Switzerland. Although the visionaries could scarcely have anticipated the magnitude of the organisation they were launching—today there are 130 member countries—the stipulation they made at the time, that FIFA had authority to organise a world championship, was the one which heralded the start of the competition as we know it today.

Yet another 26 years were to elapse before the World Championship came into being. The man who really inspired it was the man whose name the solid gold trophy bears, Jules Rimet. He was elected President of FIFA in 1920, but it was not until 1928 that a decision was taken to stage the first tournament in 1930.

With Europe as the birthplace of the organisation, it might have been fitting that the initial competition should have been played in one of the founder countries.

Instead, Uruguay, winners of the football gold medals in the 1928 Olympic Games, gained further reward. Chosen as host country, Uruguay became the first winners in a competition in which just 13 countries took part. Only four of them were from Europe—France, Belgium, Rumania and Yugoslavia. Another South American country, Argentina, was beaten by 4-2 in the final.

The cost of sending teams across the South Atlantic no doubt deterred a number of other would-be participants. That this was almost certainly true was underlined when the second competition was arranged to take place in Italy four years later. For the first time a qualifying competition was necessary, to reduce the original entry of 32 to 16. As in Uruguay, the result was a triumph for the host nation.

Italy duplicated this success in a competition of still widening scope when the 1938 series was played in Paris. Then twelve years passed, as a result of the Second World War, before Brazil acted as hosts in 1950.

England, who, along with other countries, had resigned from FIFA because of disagreements regarding amateurism and broken time payments, had rejoined, and took part in the tournament in Brazil for the first time. While much was expected from the newcomers, again it was a South American country which succeeded. Not Brazil, favourites on that occasion, but Uruguay, who beat the home country by 2-1.

The fancied team failed to come through to victory when the World Cup finals were staged by Switzerland in 1954. The great Hungarian team of the mid-1950's were automatic favourites, but the trophy went for the first time to West Germany.

The struggle for supremacy between Europe and South America was levelled-up once more in 1958. Brazil came through to victory, and repeated their triumph when Chile staged the competition four years ago.

Now the climax of the eighth competition, which began more than two years ago, is reached. And spectators from more than 100 countries are on hand to see another chapter of World Cup history written.



THE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION WORLD CUP REPORT 1966

An official report in book form is being prepared to provide a souvenir worthy of the 1966 World Cup Competition. As well as providing full reports and results of the final series of matches and qualifying rounds, it will be the only publication to carry a complete account of the organisational arrangements for staging football's premier contest in England for the first time.

REFEREES FOR THE TOURNAMENT

Referees who have had charge of matches in the Final Series were chosen by the FIFA Referees' Committee. There were 148 nominations from 82 FIFA member associations.

Fourteen African nations submitted the names of 24 referees; from 17 Asian associations 25 names were put forward; 31 European associations made 62 nominations; 12 North Central American and Caribbean associations recommended 22 officials; and the remaining 15 were listed by South American countries.

The principle of selecting seven referees from the organising country, and one from each competing finalist country, was maintained. A further nine referees were chosen from countries whose teams did not appear in the last 16.

The designation of referees and linesmen for duty at the 32 games in the Final Series, and other decisions relating to refereeing during the tournament, were taken by Sir Stanley Rous, President of FIFA, and the following members of the Referees' Committee: Prof. Dr. M. Andrejevic (Yugoslavia), Mr. P. Escartin (Spain), Mr. N. Latyshev (U.S.S.R.), Mr. A. Lindenberg (Switzerland) and Mr. Koe Ewe Teik (Malaysia).






